REPORTS FROM COUNTY AND DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

County and District Councillor Thierry reported:-

- The Chief Executive of HCC is leaving after 40 years' service (4 yrs as Chief Executive);
- HCC is changing how it calculates how much people pay for care and support at home from 95% to 100%;
- Planning & Infrastructure Bill the MP commented that councillor led planning committees tend to approve more applications than officer determination processes;
- He had intervened in the Thriving Market Place project and hoped for a briefing from HCC officers in the near future.

<u>District Cllr Haywood</u> reported on local government reorganisation and is actively working on the Stillwater Park case highlighted by residents at a previous meeting.

<u>District Councillor Richard Frampton</u> had recently been appointed to Ringwood East, Bransgore, Burley & Sopley. He introduced himself and was familiar to some as he had previously been a Town Councillor.

<u>District Councillor Rippon-Swaine</u> talked through his written report (*Annex A*). It was noted that he had recently celebrated 25 years of presidency of Ringwood Society. Cllr Day asked for support to encourage Planning Officers to have regard to compliance with Ringwood Neighbourhood Plan policies when determining planning applications.

<u>District Cllr Heron</u> reported on local government reorganisation and how challenging the timescales for implementation (set by the government) will be. The changes will have a significant impact and NFDC needs to look carefully at what it's investing in, what's deliverable and what's not worth pursuing. Plans and projections will impact on budgets, which may need to be reallocated and invested to support communities, where some services may be passed down.

REPORTS FROM TOWN COUNCILLORS

<u>Cllr Day</u> attended a meeting of Ellingham, Harbridge & Ibsley (EH&I) Parish Council when the Snails Lane planning application had been discussed. The Council is working with EH&I on its response and this will be considered by Planning, Town and Environment Committee at its meeting on 4th April. He attended a celebration recognising 50 years of New Forest District Council and 1st anniversary of the Chairman being in office. He also attended Ringwood Society's excellent AGM and commended it on the work it does, making reference to the reinstated railway signage, lamp and bench on Castleman Way. He thanked society members for their efforts and in particular Cllr M DeBoos who successfully secured grant funding.

<u>CIIr G DeBoos</u> attended NFDC's Planning Committee meeting on 12th March 2025 in relation to application 24/10919, where the officer stated 6.5 sq.m. floor area for a bedroom was compliant but would not be according to NDSS. In view of this and the misunderstanding of RNP Policy R10, he had asked for a meeting with the Chairman of NFDC Planning Committee

Page 3 of 5 Chairman's initials who had declined, so he has now asked for a meeting with the leader. He also attended a SW Quadrant meeting and reported that the Forestry Commission is looking to introduce charges for its car parks.

<u>Cllr Haywood</u> EH&I Parish Council had formed a working party of councillors and residents of Snails Lane to develop comments on the Snails Lane planning application, to meet NFDC's deadline for submissions of 11 April.

<u>Cllr Dadford</u> has been liaising with NHS Blood Donation regarding a venue in Ringwood. This had appeared promising but unfortunately the proposed venue was unable to meet all requirements and this had reached a dead end.

<u>Cllr Kelleher</u> reported he attended the Empty Bowls fundraiser event with Ringwood Food Bank at Ibsley, which was well supported. In his role as Flood Warden, he had met with Dr Peter Street. Many residents on Crow Hill have cleared the ditches outside their homes and there are some signs of improvement at the bottom of the hill. The ditch in Wrights field has also been cleared. Barrack Lane and Charles's Lane are full of potholes and there are other issues needing attention. The County Councillor offered to assist in identifying HCC's local engineer.

DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

NFDC PLACE & SUSTAINABILITY OVERVIEW & SCRUTINY PANEL Meeting 13 March 2025.

(Recommendations to NFDC Cabinet to meet in April 2025.)

1. Climate Change Adaptation.

- Panel to note a Report on the need for climate adaptation within the New Forest and to highlight what actions could be taken by residents and the Council to adapt to a changing climate.
- Adapt to seasonal changes, e.g. warmer, wetter winters and hotter and dryer summers, more intense and frequent storms and extreme weather events.
- Four Key Hazards: Flooding, Coastal Erosion, Heatwaves & Air Quality.
- Those living in certain areas or with certain conditions may be more vulnerable: e.g. ageing population, Under 5's, health conditions, low incomes.
- Focus on key information and actions for a range of stakeholders, residents, officers & councillors.
- Next steps to include sharing action guides internally and externally and update the climate adaptation webpage.

2. UK Share Prosperity Fund 2025/26.

- Report to Panel showed Total Fund available and spent for 2025-26 was £326k, which included £13k administration.
- Capital Projects (£113k) approved included Noticeboards to improve wayfinding to local businesses & destinations and replacement of public litter bins at end of life to align to new waste collection service.
- Revenue Projects (£200k) approved included the NEET Support Programme & NF Apprenticeship Hub.

3. New Waste Collection Update.

- Ringwood Depot to introduce new system of wheelie bin collection from October 2025.
- Use your postcode to check the start date and the type of service allocated to your property at newforest.gov.uk/FindYourPhase.
- All properties to receive an explanation letter prior to commencement of the service. Details and criteria can be viewed at newforest.gov.uk/AssistedCollections.
