#### C/7333 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

There were 7 members of public present from Stillwater Park to update on the ongoing situation regarding one of their neighbours and the resulting environmental nuisance. One representative read a letter she had sent to the Ombudsman seeking resolution of the issue. She criticised NFDC for failing to take enforcement action and for failing in their duty of care to protect residents.

The Town Mayor empathised with the residents and implored District Councillors to do all they could to assist.

District Cllr Thierry suggested convening a meeting with the relevant Director at NFDC, District Councillors and representatives from the Police and Stillwater Park. District Cllr Haywood also agreed to follow up with NFDC officers.

#### **POLICE REPORT**

Sergeant Chris Pell presented the Neighbourhood Policing Team quarterly report (*Annex A*).

He reported a 4.3% reduction in crimes reported over the last 12 months in Ringwood town area. The team regularly reviews priorities and he encouraged feedback from the community to inform this, and also asked that all crime be reported.

Shoplifting remains a priority and some progress is being made. The most prolific offenders have been identified and work is taking place to tackle this. One offender had been charged and sentenced to 6-months and it was hoped a Community Behaviour Order would be in place on his release.

There had been a slight decrease in formal action taken in comparison to the previous year. The level of staffing and abstractions influenced this, but the team was working hard to make a difference and make the town a better place.

Members thanked Sergeant Pell for his report and praised his attitude and approach.

The above graph shows the number of offences recording for past 12 months in the area your local Neighbourhood Police Team (including the Fordingbridge Officers) operate, this includes beats outside of the Ringwood Town area. You will note a 4.3% reduction in crimes recorded, whilst this is a positive we continue to work hard to ensure we try to make Ringwood and the surrounding area even safer for residents, there remains much to do!

As mentioned previously, towards the end of last year we made a change to improve the way in which we engage with local representatives with a monthly meeting now taking place between Sergeant Pell, Inspector Ord and Chris Wilkins during which we are looking to gather information relating to the concerns of the community in order to better focus our resources and understand community priorities.

As a result of discussions with Chris Wilkins we have ammended the presentation of the crime stats to now show the most recent 3 months compared to the same period the year before (SPLY – Similar Period Last Year)

### **Current Priorities for the Ringwood Neighbourhood Policing Team**

**Shoplifting** – Business crime remains an area priority. We are attending all reports, building links to the local businesses and detecting more offences – through CCTV and utilising Facial Recognition ID. Use of Out of Court disposals as well as court summons employed.

Anti-Social Behaviour – We are aware of concerns from local businesses relating to groups of youths causing problems within the town, we have identified those involved and are working with partners to ensure they face consequences for their behaviour, we have gathered evidence to seek a CBO against one of the main perpetrators of ASB in the town, this is a work in progress.

## Successes/Outcomes

- In March we arrested and remanded Ringwood's most prolific shoplifter, your local Policing Team gathered evidence to charge him with 7 offences and he was placed before the Courts and was sentenced to 6 months, we are looking at a Community Behavioural Order (CBO, formally known as an ASBO) in order to protect the community when he is released.
- In April 25 we arrested an intoxicated and abusive male who was causing issued in the Poulner area. We arrived on scene after receiving multiple calls and within a few minutes and were able to safely take him into custody. He was subsequently charged with offences and we will be working to obtain Court Orders to ensure he is dealt with robustly if he continues.
- PC Ian Bigland seized an E-Scooter which was being ridden into on-coming traffic and issued the rider with a traffic offence report for no insurance. E-Scooters are regulated and we will take action against those who flout the law and use them illegally.
- Arrest of male who stole metal racking from outside a business within the town, Ringwood Police Team worked with colleagues in Southampton locate and arrest the suspect at his home address later in the day, the racking was still on his truck on his driveway!




















In addition, and to give you a flavour of the type of incidents we are dealing with on a daily basis, we have been involved in the following

Attended a report of a vulnerable old man walking in the carriageway in his pyjamas.

Issued a Dog Behaviour Contract as part of an out of court disposal to the owner of a dog that was dangerously out of control and bit someone.
